Dogs Must Be Leashed and Pet Waste Cleaned Up

Elko New Market City Code requires that dogs must be kept on a leash at all times when not on the pet owner's private property. There is no provision for dogs to be allowed to run in open spaces such as parks or school playgrounds. City Code also requires that animal owners must clean up after their dogs. A scooper and plastic bags are two simple ways to comply with the law. Failure to comply with either ordinance can result in a fine.

Please be a responsible pet owner, a responsible citizen and a good neighbor by keeping your dog on a leash and cleaning up your dog's waste. This means picking up waste that has been deposited on someone else's property as well as public streets, sidewalks and parks.
